STUDENTS UNDER HIGHER EDUCATION

As informed earlier, we have 35 students under the Higher Education Programme, we update on a few students.

Keerthana: Keerthana lost her father due to sickness when she was 10 years old. Her mother is also sick and affected due to Tuberculosis. Keerthana has six elder siblings. She joined KWTC under the Residential care and attended Kings School to Year 5. She completed her Year 12 successfully this year and has joined Bachelor of Arts, doing major in English, at Panagudi Manormaniam Sundarnar University.



Subramanian: Subramanian lost his father when he was five years old. His mother was left with no earnings and got help from KWTC. Subramanian then joined KWTC under the residential care and attended a tamil medium school to Year 3. Later, he was joined to Kings School to Year 5. Though difficult to learn lessons in English in the beginning, gradually started learning lessons in English and also started communicating in English. He successfully completed his Year 12 and joined Bachelor of Computer Applications in Johns College, Palayamkottai and is very well doing his second year. It is a three-year course.

VOLUNTEERS AT KWTC

Eliza Mould – Visited KWTC on 5th January, 2018. She assessed the children in the Kindergarten in reading and alphabet learning. In the Primary classes, she did reading assessment for all junior school and remedial class for Marwin; while in the Middle School did English classes for Thamodira Muthu of Year 6 and also supported the French classes for Year 11 & 12. 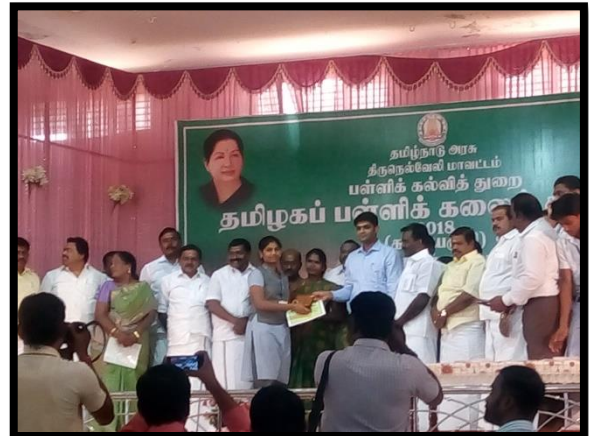

The orientation was very informative as the session was very interactive and sharing of ideas took place among the teachers. They got lot of tacks and techniques to train the students, by meeting the subject experts.

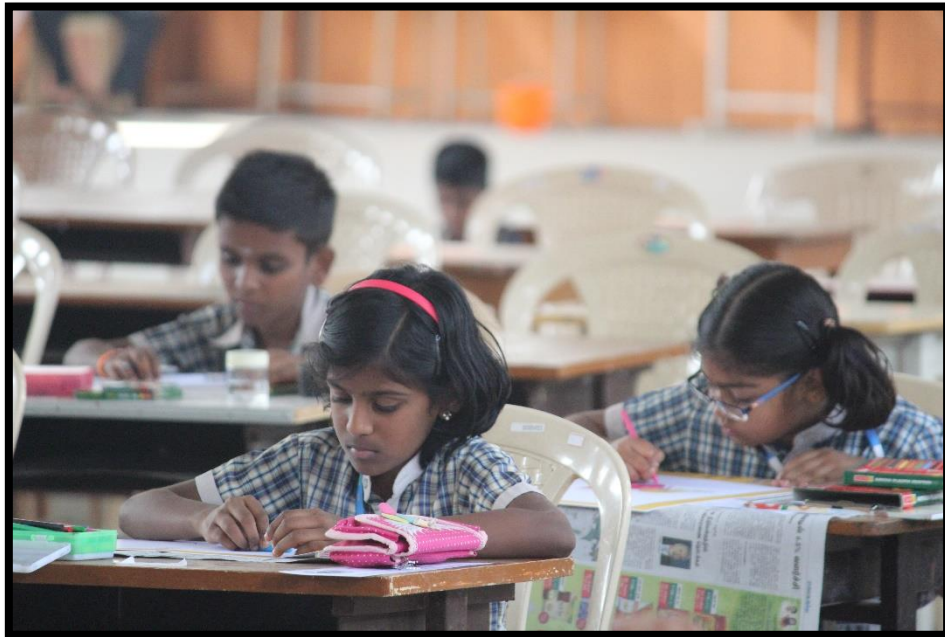


HINDU YOUNG WORLD PAINTING COMPETITION
