ACHIEVEMENTS OF BURSARY CHILDREN IN SWIMMING:

First State Level Swimming Championship was held at Pavai Group of Institution, Namakkal on 4th November. Around 400 swimmers from all over Tamilnadu participated. Around 30 students from Kings Schools including few bursary children participated under age groups 1 to 6. We came as runners up with 13 gold, 10 silver, 12 bronze medals and 2 Individual championships. The bursary children updates are given below:

Siranjeev Adhavan of Year 5, he got a gold medal in 4x50 freestyle relay and 2 bronze medals in 100m IM & 25m breaststroke.
