



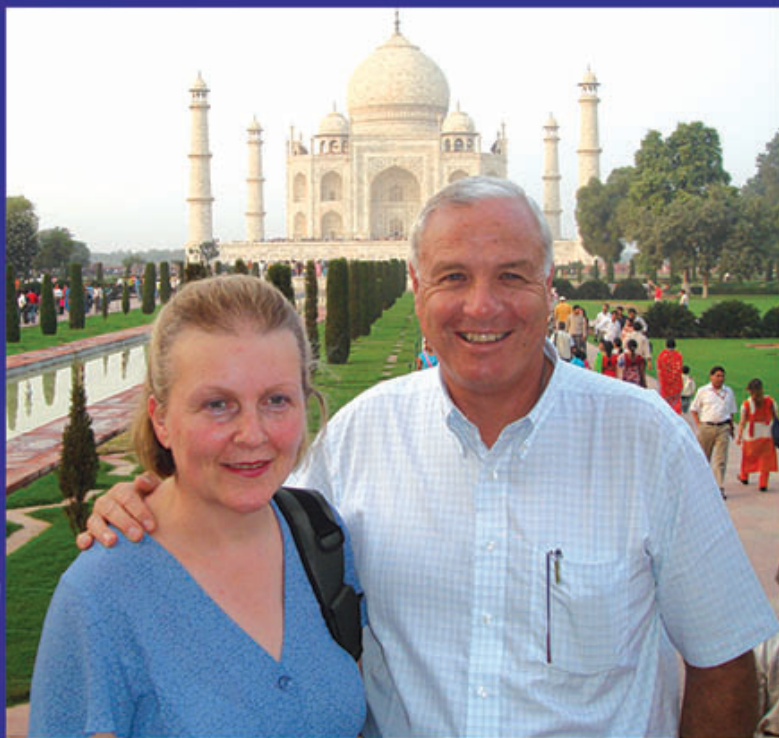
SILVER JUBILEE SOUVENIR KINGS WORLD TRUST FOR CHILDREN



Kings World Trust for Children was founded in southern India in 1994 to provide a home, an education and skills training for children who were orphaned, homeless, disadvantaged and disabled.

The Charity started when Colin Wagstaff and his wife, Anne-Marie, were asked to look after an 11 year-old Indian boy, Antonyraj, who had been brought to the UK, by another Charity for medical treatment; Antony lived with the Wagstaff family and their children for several months. During Antony's stay in UK, Colin made contact with a Tamil family in Manchester, Doctor & Mrs Leslie, to resolve some issues surrounding Antony's stay. It then transpired that Dr. Leslie came from the same small town in south Tamil Nadu where Antony lived in a hostel for disadvantaged children.

Colin went back to India with Antony with aim of finding a safe space for Antony, his sister and a few other children known to Antony. Colin spent one month in India and stayed with Dr. Leslie's family. He saw at first hand the poverty, deprivation and lack of real opportunities for children from low income and disadvantaged families.



He met many people in India who shared his desire to bring about change; among them, Navamani James, the nephew of Dr. Leslie. Together Colin, Doctor & Mrs. Leslie & Navamani planned a children's village and set about making it happen. Colin & Navamani managed the operations in India and Colin also became a professional 'beggar' to raise funds in the UK. The Trust started with Colin, 5 children, a housekeeper and a motorbike and developed from there. The following projects have evolved from this early beginning 25 years ago:

- 2 Children's Villages for orphaned, poor and disadvantaged children.
- Outreach programme supporting the education of children in the local community.
- Outreach programme supporting children with physical and mental disabilities and children who are terminally ill in their own homes
- Support and financial programmes for students to attend University, Polytechnic and Skills centred courses.
- Health education programme in local communities
- Primary Health Clinic
- Emergency Aid, reconstruction and livelihood rebuilding following the devastating Tsunami which struck the coastal areas of southern Tamil Nadu in 2004.
- Programme enabling skilled and unskilled volunteers from the UK and other Countries to support the work of Kings in India.
- The construction, management and operation of Kings Matriculation and Kings CBSE schools

Kings World Trust for Children was a joint effort between Uncle Colin and his Indian friends that he met during his first stay in India. Uncle Colin and Navamani started the journey by building a "Children's Village" where every child received a hands-on quality education with homely affection and care. In 1995 the village set off on its journey with 5 children and went onto supporting 40 children by May 1995 with Uncle Colin multi-tasking the roles of father, cook, house master, medical nurse, driver, teacher and caring for every one of them. From a British Army officer to the founder of a life changing Trust, Uncle Colin along with Navamani and his team gave birth to a revolutionary Charitable Trust that has made a great number of children and young people much more self-reliant, confident and self-sufficient and given them opportunity, a sustainable career and real hope for their future as a citizen of modern India.

Colin Wagstaff came to Chinnammalpuram village in South India.



1995

Kings World Trust for Children was founded in this village in South India to provide home and education for disadvantaged children. The home started with five children and a foster mother.



1996

- Four more cottages for children were built and 40 more children were admitted.
- A group of English volunteers came and taught English in the local schools of Tamilnadu attended by the Trust children.



1997

- Another four children's cottages and other facilities were built and by now the home had 80 boys and girls.



1998

- KWTC launched a 'health education' programme to give health awareness to the women and children in the rural communities.



1999

- Haslemere parish in the UK which is home to the church of Mr. Colin, donated money to buy 10 acres of farmland as their millennium gift to the trust. In that 10 acres of land the trust developed a farm with fruit trees and vegetables.



2000

In order to support the need of the children from the coastal community, the Trust started a new home 'Kings Haven' in Idayankudi village near the coast. It became an exclusive home for boys and we admitted 30 of them.



2001

- KWTC started its 'Outreach' programme to provide support and guidance for very poor and orphaned children enabling them to continue in full-time education.
- A 'Medical Outreach' Programme had also been introduced to give care and support for the children who have physical and mental disabilities.
- The Trust also started Physiotherapy centres at its Chinammalpuram and Pudhur site with residential nurses and visiting physiotherapists.



2002

- As the need to start an exclusive home for girls arose, the Trust started a new home 'Kings Field' as part of the Pudhur site, providing homes for 80 more orphaned and very poor girls.



2003

- The total number of children in the residential care rose to 250.
- More facilities such as Classrooms, IT facilities, Skills training workshop were constructed to provide after-school on-site teaching and training.



2004

- The tsunami hit Southern India and KWTC became heavily involved in relief work, supplying immediate food and clothing to homeless families and also in projects including the reconstruction of two schools in the village of Kuthankuly.



2005

- Catering to the needs of the community, the Trust decided to start an English medium school. Kings English School foundation stone was laid by Mr. Stuart Innes, British Deputy High Commissioner in South India. The school started teaching from Kindergarten up to year 7 with 400 students on the 50 acre Kings farm site.

- Kings School started its bursary to support children in need for them to excel in academics and sports.



2006

- Kings School strength increased to 650.
- New facilities like Bake Library, Kindergarten expansion, a new science block and Junior School building were added to the Kings School site.



2007

- The School's strength went up to 900 +.
- In this time, Kings School won the overall championship trophy in the southern Tamilnadu swimming competition. Two swimmers were selected to swim for Tamilnadu.



2008

- The school's strength went up to 1100+.
- The Foundation stone for the Art Centre was laid by His Excellency Mr. Mike Connor, British Deputy High Commissioner to Southern India.



2009

- The completed Art centre was opened on 30th April.
- The first 42 students appeared for the 10th public examination and all of them passed successfully scoring good marks.



2010

- The school's strength has risen to 1250+
- Dr. Leslie Medical Centre was opened on 19 Feb 2010 with 12 beds for the use of trust and school students.
- The new 'Music Centre' opened.



2011

- The school's strength has risen to 1350 +
- The Foundation stone for the multipurpose hall 'Burden Centre' was laid by Rev. Ade Ademola & Mr. Mike Dyer fellowship of St. John (UK) trust association.
- In the first batch of Class 12 board exams, Kings Matric Higher Secondary school's student, Deena Mishael, bagged the district first place. Deena became the first student to practise in medicine.
- In class 10 public exams, Madhumitha won the districts third place.



2012

- A big shift in the Trust's operations occurred in 2012. The Trust closed all its Residential homes and smoothly re-settled all the residential students moving them either as Kings School boarders or as Outreach children.
- Kings School strength has risen to 1400.
- The Trust shifted its focus to support the disadvantaged children in their community through an 'Outreach' programme and 'Bursary' sponsorship at Kings School.

2013

- Mr. Colin Wagstaff, the founder of Kings World Trust for Children and Kings School has been awarded the OBE title by Her Majesty the Queen to recognise his dedicated services to Education and Young Communities for the disadvantaged children in South India. This is one of the most prestigious personal honours that the Queen can make to an individual and is the highest level of formal recognition for exceptional work.
- Kings CBSE School foundation stone was laid by His Excellency Mr. Mike Nithavrianakis, the then British Deputy High Commissioner to Southern India.
- In the class 12 public exams, Madhumitha stood first in the Educational District.
- The school strength has risen to 1500+



2014

- The new Kings CBSE School was started with the intension to focus on interests, abilities, and learning styles of each individual student. The school started with 176 students.
- In class 10 public exams, Kings Matric Higher Secondary School won second rank in Tamilnadu state. Sarah Sundar achieved an outstanding result by scoring 498/500.
- In Class 12 public exams, Kings School won the top three places in the Educational district. Maxine Michelle achieved an outstanding result by scoring 1182/1200.



2015

- Kings CBSE School strength has risen to 240.

2016

- In class 10 Public exams, Shanusa Bright scored 497/500, we were ranked as 3rd in Tamil Nadu.
- In Class 12 public exams, Rekshiny got 1181/1200 and we stood 1st place in the Education District.



2017

- In class 12 Public exams, Shinusha Bright scored 1189/1200 and stood first in the Education District.
- Senior school was expanded and two new classrooms were added.
- The Junior School was expanded to take double the amount of students.
- CBSE School strength reached 400.



2018

- Kings Schools pupils helped with Kerala flood relief effort during the month of August.
- Kings School was recognised by the Tamil Nadu government with the 'Clean School Award' Swachh Vidyalaya Puraskar.
- Extension building for CBSE school started.



2019

- Our School band has qualified for the Grand Finale in the Torrins Battle of the Bands - Regional Eliminations this year.
- Sanjeev Athavan of Class 7 won a bronze medal in 4x100m freestyle relay in the National competition.
- CBSE school strength went up to 570 students.
- The first batch of CBSE students appeared for the class 10 board exam and all got through successfully.



2020

- KWTC celebrates its Silver Jubilee and continues to change lives in the community through its outreach and bursary programme.
- The extension building of the CBSE School is almost completed and will be opened for the student's use in April 2020. This new building will have 12 additional classrooms, Science labs, Computer room, Art centre, Music centre and an office as well.
- Kings Senior Basketball team got 3rd place in the Tamilnadu State Competition.
- Kings Schools continues to excel in academics, sports and cultural.



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Silver Jubilee Celebration of KWTC

This prestigious event packed a day full of joy and merriment as both Matric and CBSE schools came together in dance and activities, uniting the trust as a jubilation of our community. The school was fortunate enough to have the company of a special guest: Padma Shri Shiny Wilson, Gold medalist at the Asian Games. The school thanks her very much for her commitment towards Kings School.

The day started with a warm welcome address and a few words from our Founder and Chairman. Ceremonies followed with two addresses from our esteemed guests and hoisting of the three flags. This marked the special occasion as a symbol of strength in the community at Kings School. After, cultural processions and dances were laid on by the students.
