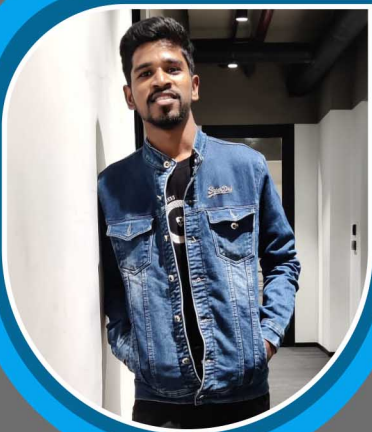


## SUCCESSFUL STORIES OF EX-TRUST STUDENTS

# TEACHERS EMPOWERMENT PROGRAMME

The programme started with the session of the Correspondent around 9:30 A.M. All the teachers of both the schools attended the meeting.
